## The International Youth Forum "Brussels Dialogue-2020" will be held in an online/"hybrid" format in October and November 2020

On 9-10 October 2020, we will be honored to present together with the MGIMO-University and the Alexander Gorchakov Public Diplomacy Foundation, Global Alumni Alliance the "Brussels Dialogue-2020" forum.

The main theme of the forum is "Common History and Common Future. 75 years of responsibility for peace".

In 2020, in the year of the 75th anniversary of Victory and the end of the Second World War and the 75th anniversary of the United Nations, the forum will be focused on the topic of preservation of historical memory, as well as the role of international cooperation within the UN and the Council of Europe and the role of youth in the 21st century to ensure and develop world peace established after World War II.

"We will talk about how the preservation of historical memory and the rejection of historical distortions will enable us to create the common future that we want to see. Dialogue with European historians, journalists and political scientists who will participate in the forum is particularly important for us here," said Director of the Centre Vera Bunina.

The uniqueness of the Forum is its "hybrid" format: the discussions will be held online on 9-10 October, while the Live Youth Dialogue Concert will be held on the stage of the Russian Centre with all the necessary safety measures for spectators on 20 November 2020.

The geographical location of the forum and the presence of eminent experts transforms this Brussels event into a truly global event; experts will represent various international organisations of the UN and the Council of Europe and the participants themselves will also come from a wide range of countries across the world.

The Concert evening on 20 November will also be unique: guests will enjoy a dialogue concert in "hybrid" format, where the Belgian music group "Panienki" and Russian musicians from the Tavrida Art Cluster will perform.

"History lessons: facts and fakes"

Interactive Platform No. 2

" WWII Aftershock: the United Nations and the Council of Europe"

Discussion platform No. 3 and conclusions

"The role of youth in peace-building: yesterday, today, tomorrow"

The speakers of the discussion will be representatives of leading European and Russian analytic centres, universities, major national museums and cultural sites.

The Forum will be attended by representatives of youth and student associations, youth councils, journalists, young entrepreneurs, representatives of scientific, political and information circles, experts in various fields.

**Evgeny PRIMAKOV**, Head of Rossotrudnichestvo, **Alexander TOKOVININ**, Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary ambassador the Russian Federation to the Kingdom of Belgium, will make a welcome speech.

The Gorchakov Foundation will hold a **Dialogue atelier** with forum participants: a group discussion on the preservation of history: "Memory and lessons of the Second World War". The experts will be **Daria LOBANOVA**, Deputy Executive Director of the Gorchakov Foundation and **Alexei FENENKO**, Associate Professor of the Faculty of World Policy at Lomonosov Moscow State University, member of the Gorchakov Club.

The participants will be invited to "PEACE CineClub" to watch a documentary "Nuremberg. 70 years after" by Aleksandr Zvyagintsev on the current peace agenda with further discussion.
